How important was the Newman Community for you in depending your faith?


Incredibly important. There is a bit of serendipity in all of this, because during my undergraduate I lived less than a holy life. So when I came to EIU as a grad student, I saw a chance to reframe my life. I started coming to Adoration and Mass. I got involved in the Knights of Columbus, eventually becoming the Grand Knight, and I experienced a community of students who love the Lord and lived their life for Him. In fact, it was at Newman during Adoration that I made my decision to apply for the seminary. And whether I stay six years and get ordained or six months and discern out I am so glad Newman became my spiritual home.

From your perspective, how important is a life of faith to you?

Most important. Most of the messages we receive in college is DO WHAT YOU WANT. It is very me-centered. And so, realizing there is a community wanting to live out faith and to be a witness to the presence of God is so vital. It didn't look like that in undergrad. When I got here I made a decision to live out my faith. The shift we all have to make is to live for the Other and for others. I grew into what love is: self-giving. We have to give ourselves to those around us. It is a reflection of Christ's love. It helps us to realize we are playing for the endgame, which is heaven.


